<u>Culture</u> is a set of codes.

Maintaining decorum is what keeps society together

(What else differentiates us from brooding tribesmen, ready at any moment to erupt in war?)

Maintaining decorum is what keeps fascists in power

(fascists love etiquette, fascism loves rules)

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(Decorum: noun. behavior in keeping with good taste, Geschmacksache)

It is undesirable to be uncivilized :: It is ugly to be uncivilized. A lack of civility is a sign of profound indignity

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(A lack of civility is a jolt to reality: when rules are broken, they are deconstructed.)

Can a War on Civility, be a Civil War?
